Dear parents/carers of children in Year 6,

To support your child with their transition to Year 7, they will be taking part in some transition workshops in school this half term.

Session 1: Behaviour systems

Session 2: How to read a timetable/timetable week

Session 3: Well-being

During these sessions, the children will be split into small workshops where they will explore the way secondary schools work in comparison to primary school and will have the chance to ask questions and express things they are looking forward to and any worries they might have.

As part of the transition work to ensure your child is ready for Year 7, there will be some small changes made to the way Year 6 operates. This will include the way that homework is set.

The main changes we would like to inform you of are the way our behaviour system will be adapted to prepare your child for secondary school. Adaptations will be made to their class 'good to be green' system so that they experience what it might be like in secondary school. Here is how it will change:

Stop and think card – this will now be called a C1. Your child will have a chance to change their behaviour and will be able to move back to green if they do so.

Warning card – this will now be called a C2. Your child will be given a verbal warning. They may also be asked to move seats or spend some time out of the classroom.

Consequence card – this will now be called a C3. Parents will be informed via text message regarding their child's behaviour and your child will be asked to stay in for 10 minutes at playtime as a consequence.



Additionally, we will be helping your child learn how to tie a tie, so if you do have any old or spare ties that you no longer need, any donations would be gratefully accepted! Please pass them on to your child's teacher.

If you have any questions, please ask your child's class teacher and they will be more than happy to help.
