WALT - Can I write the main section to my persuasive writing?

<p>Middle: a series of sentences which persuades the reader to visit the location organised by using topic sentences around what you could/should do or see and what the traveller may experience. (modals) Each topic sentence is followed by elaboration – further info, ‘expert’ evidence or benefits to the reader. Persuasive devices used such as description and precise choice of vocabulary (noun phrases, verbs/adverbs) within boastful phrases</p>	<p>Describe what it will be like on the rapids. Make it sound amazing by using boastful language.</p> <p>Include facts about the river.</p> <p>Explain that you can hike too. Describe the views and what you might see on the way.</p> <p>End the section with a rhetorical question. Could you....? Will you...? Would you?</p>
<p>Ending: Sums up the reason why the traveller should visit. Further persuasive devices used such as boastful language / rhetorical questions</p>	<p>Write one final sentence using boastful language to persuade.</p> <p>Start the sentence with an imperative verb.</p>
