

WALT - Can I end a newspaper report in the present tense?

A newspaper report is always written in the past tense but in the last paragraph it changes to the present tense to explain what is happening 'now.'

4. Nine children each bring in 147p towards their class' Comic Relief fund. How much money did they bring in altogether?

5. At a theme park, 592 people each paid an £8 entrance fee. How much did the park make from these people?
