

**WALT - Can I identify determiners in sentences?**

Determiners are words which normally go before a noun in a sentence and they tell us something about that noun. They might tell us how many or who the noun belongs to. All of the words in the grid below are different types of determiners.

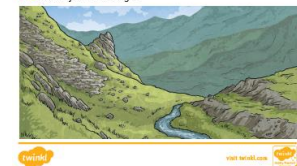
**Reading: Information Retrieval**
