

WALT - Can I use inverted commas to write quotes?

Yesterday, you learnt about how to write a stand first to begin a newspaper report. Another feature of newspaper reports is quotes.



A newspaper reporter, includes the exact words of someone that they interview about the incident. The reporter uses inverted commas to show what the person said and the verbs commented/stated/explained/reported.

EXAMPLE:

**"I was so shocked when I walked in to my Grandma's house and realised it wasn't her in the bed," commented Little Red Riding Hood.**

WALT: Can I use short division?

It is important to know the division facts for the times tables. This will help you with short division.

Complete these facts:

If you know -	$3 \times 4 = 12$	you also know	$12 \div 3 = \underline{\quad}$
$5 \times 5 = 25$	$25 \div 5 = \underline{\quad}$	$6 \times 5 = 30$	$30 \div 6 = \underline{\quad}$
$4 \times 8 = 32$	$32 \div 8 = \underline{\quad}$	$7 \times 6 = 42$	$42 \div 7 = \underline{\quad}$
$9 \times 3 = 27$	$27 \div 3 = \underline{\quad}$	$9 \times 8 = 72$	$72 \div 8 = \underline{\quad}$
$12 \times 4 = 48$	$48 \div 4 = \underline{\quad}$	$7 \times 4 = 28$	$28 \div 4 = \underline{\quad}$

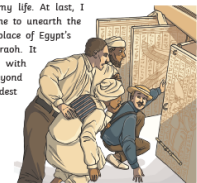
Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun. Read the extract from his diary and answer the questions below.
