Here's the full list of the materials you'll need if you can get them:

- Toilet Roll
- Pink & White card (ears & feet)
- Googly eyes
- Pink pom pom
- Grey pipe cleaners
- Yellow & white feathers
- Scissors
- White paint
- Glue

If you don't have access to any of the extra resources like pipe cleaners etc. just use pens and pencils to draw them on. If you have paint you can paint the rabbit instead.

## Chocolate Easter Egg Nest Cakes

### Ingredients

225g/8oz plain chocolate, broken into pieces  
2 tbsp golden syrup  
50g/2oz butter  
75g/2 $\frac{3}{4}$ oz cornflakes  
36 mini chocolate eggs

### Method

Line a 12-hole fairy cake tin with paper cases.

Melt the chocolate; golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth.

Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.

Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.

### Recipe Tips

Shredded wheat or puffed rice cereals can be used instead of the cornflakes.
