6. Was it part of their imaginations, or something more sinister?

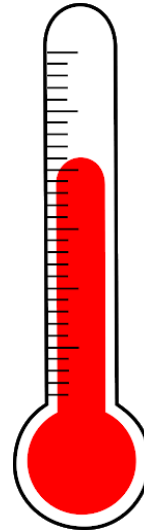

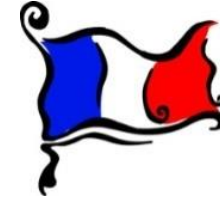
Reading Thermometers

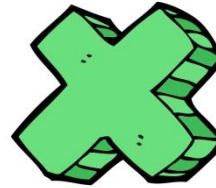


Multiplying
