Numeracy

Roman Numerals

Have a go at the questions below all about Roman Numerals. Can you remember some of them?

Here are three letters used to indicate numbers:

I = 1 V = 5 X = 10

Follow these rules to help you read Roman numbers:

1. If a larger Roman Numeral is followed by a smaller one, you add the two together. You also need to add if the Roman numeral are the same, e.g:
 XI = 10 + 1 = 11
 XX = 10 + 10 = 20
2. If a smaller Roman Numeral is followed by a larger number symbol, you must subtract the smaller Roman Numeral from the larger one.
 IX = 10 - 1 = 9
 IV = 5 - 1 = 4

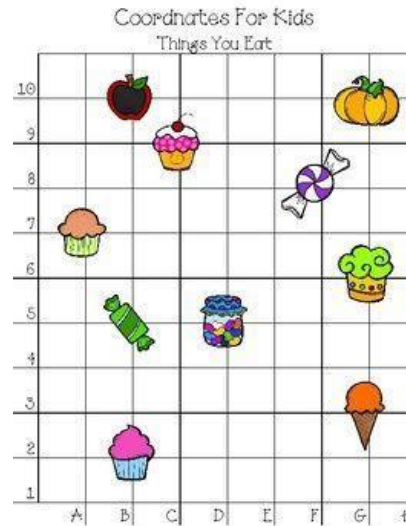

Coordinates

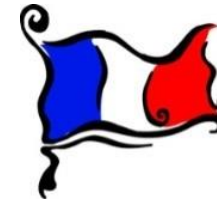

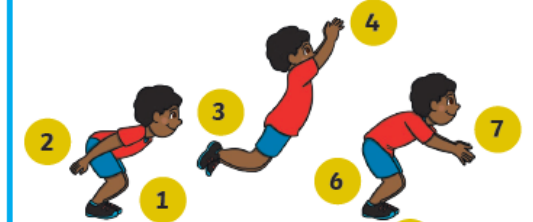


PE

Event: Standing Long Jump

- 1 Bend your ankles, knees and hips ready for take-off.
- 2 Swing your arms behind your body.
- 3 Straighten your legs to take off, with both feet leaving the ground together.
- 4 Swing your arms forward and up.
- 5 Land on both feet at the same time.
- 6 Bend your ankles, knees and hips to absorb the impact on landing.
- 7 If you need to, keep your arms out in front or to the side to remain in balance.

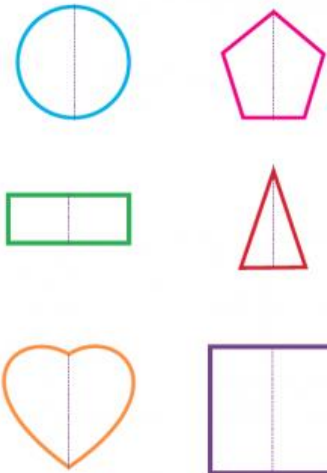

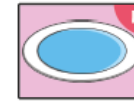
