The thief was wearing a torn dirty, shirt when he stole the lady's purse.  
The thief was wearing a torn, dirty shirt when he stole the lady's purse.
  
- 5) The rich chocolatey sponge, pudding was served for dessert.  
The rich, chocolatey sponge pudding was served for dessert.  
The rich chocolatey, sponge pudding was served for dessert.  
The rich chocolatey sponge pudding, was served for dessert.
