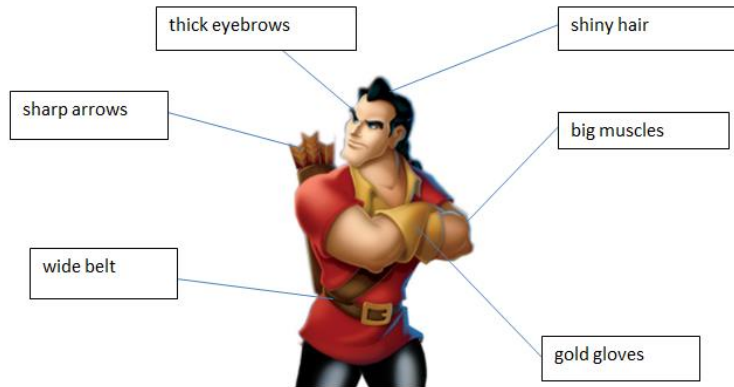


Literacy - WALT - Can I write a character description?

Look at the sheet in your pack and come up with different adjectives to describe Gaston.



Now you have lots of adjective ideas, write a character description about Gaston. A good character description should;

- Use adjectives
- Describe how they move
- Use similes
- Create a bit of mystery

WALT: Can I solve questions using Roman Numerals?

Yesterday you looked at Roman Numerals.

Here is a song all about Roman Numerals

Listen to the song to help get the numbers into your head.

Remember sometimes a smaller symbol comes before a larger one, for example IV. This means 1 less than 5 so the symbol IV is 4.

This also happens with larger numbers for example XC is 90 because X is 10 and C is 100 (XC is 10 less than 100 - so 90).

Can you work out what XL is?

Here is a clue L = 50 and X = 10.

Now complete the worksheet attached that looks like this:

We Romans deigned a fantastic way of adding and subtracting... I challenge you to solve my problems.

I	V	X	L	C
1	5	10	50	100

Two things you must know:

1. A letter after a larger value letter means you add it:
E.G. XI is 10 + 1 = 11 or CX is 100 + 10 = 110

2. A small valued letter before a big one means you take it away:
E.G. IX is 10 - 1 = 9 or XC is 100 - 10 = 90

Work out what numbers these Roman numerals represent:

Solve these roman number sentences, write the answer in numbers.

Solve these number sentences; write the answer in roman numerals.

The Romans didn't have a symbol for 0. They didn't use place holders like us so be careful if there is a number like 202.

You would work out 200 first.

100 is C

200 is CC

Now there are no 10s so for Roman Numerals you ignore that column now. Then there is 2 which is II

So 202 is CCII.
