Literacy

WALT: Can I write in the past tense?

Verbs are used to describe an action. For example, the word 'jumped' in this sentence:

The rabbit **jumped** in the field.

A regular past tense **verb** ends in the suffix -ed but an irregular past tense verb does not!

Can you find the past tense verbs in these sentences? Remember not all of the **verbs** are regular!

4. The rabbit hopped away quickly when the car came past.

Example: Little Red Riding Hood **skipped** to her Grandma's house. She **frowned** when she saw a big wolf and **grasped** her basket tightly.

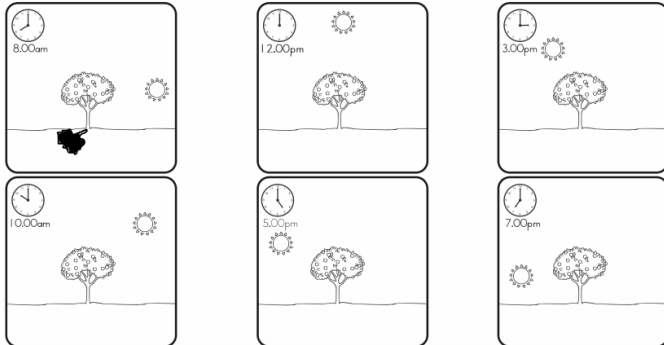
Can you tell an adult what you found out?

Remember, light can only travel in a straight line. A shadow is formed when something blocks light.

When the light source (**sun**) moves, the shadow will change. When the light source is directly above the object, the shadow will be directly underneath. When the light source is to one side of the object, the shadow will appear on the **opposite** side.

Can you draw the shadows on your sheet? Have a look at where the sun is in the sky in each image to help you! The first one is done for you.
