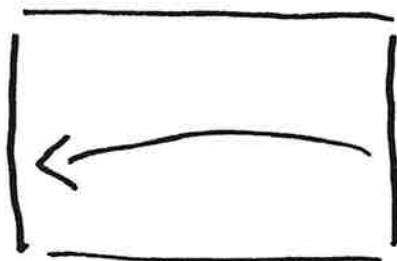


Make Your Own Books

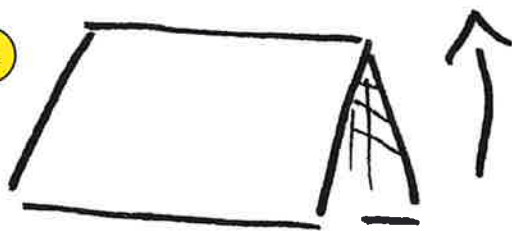
In the landscape position fold paper in half.

2



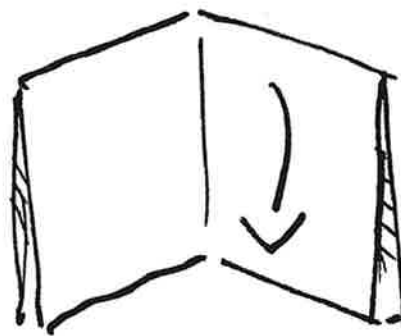
Fold in half again.

3



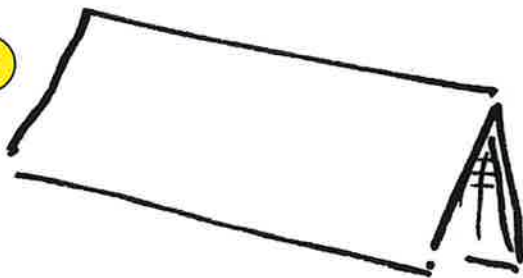
Open this fold.

4



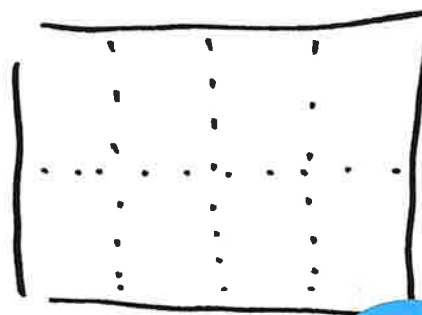
With the fold at the top fold downwards in half.
